*Re: Community Conversation with Parents: Primary School Provision in South Belfast (Castlereagh / Carryduff areas)*

A research team from the School of Education at Ulster University is undertaking an independent Community Conversation in October 2018 to gather the views of parents affected or potentially affected by the issue of over-subscribed primary schools in the South Belfast (Castlereagh / Carryduff areas) in order to report on possible short and longer-term solutions.
